


Pea Soup: A Winter Tradition

Through the many years of Penetanguishene's Winterama, there have been many traditions and activities that have come and gone but one that has remained staple to the weekend is the serving of traditional French Canadian pea soup. Why is pea soup a traditional winter tradition?

Rooted in the early 1600s, Pea Soup or Split Pea Soup holds tales of the voyageurs, French-Canadian fur traders who navigated vast landscapes. These early explorers were acutely aware of the need for sustenance that could endure harsh conditions without spoiling. Split peas are high in protein, easy to store, and versatile. When paired with salt pork, a durable protein source, this soup became a crucial nourishment source on their long journeys. This simple yet nutritious blend offered sustenance and warmth against the brutal Canadian winters. Over time, as the Francophone community flourished and cultures melded, the soup gained prominence in households, evolving in complexity and flavor, but always retaining its core.

The serving of Pea Soup at our Winterama is a cultural nod to the French– Canadian roots in our community and the Voyagueur roots of many that live in our area. Here at the museum we take pride in serving this dish since the first year of our museum's inception in 1968. We hope you enjoy your cup this winter.
