Time Capsule Unveiling for May is Museum Month

Two time capsules have been discovered in the walls of former local high schools, Penetanguishene Secondary School (PSS) and Midland Secondary School (MSS).

The discovery of the PSS time capsule, located behind the school's cornerstone at the former school site, occurred during the building's demolition completed by the Town of Penetanguishene in late March, just three years after the demolition of MSS and the opening of the new Georgian Bay District Secondary School (GBDSS).

Since its placement in 1966 behind the facility cornerstone, the time capsule remained untouched as dozens of graduating classes walked unknowingly past it through the school's front doors over the years.

When the Simcoe County District School Board learned that a time capsule had been found during the PSS demolition, it was shared that a similar container was found at MSS and was in safe keeping at GBDSS.

An unveiling of both time capsules was held at the Penetanguishene Museum in celebration of International Museum Day on May 18th.

At the unveiling, Simcoe County District School

Board Trustee Tyler Boswell, along with the Mayors of Penetanguishene and Midland opened the time capsules along with the assistance of the Curator of the Penetanguishene Museum and the Curator of the Huronia Museum. The contents of each container will be displayed at the Penetanguishene Museum for one month and then transported to Huronia Museum to be viewed for another month.

Connecting with our ancestors:

A photovoice project on returning to Drummond Island

June 21st to August 23rd

How might contemporary people connect with their ancestors and each other? For those whose relatives came to the Penetanguishene area, also known as the place of the rolling white sands, in the late 1820s and early 1830s, many of our ancestors' lives were connected to the Great Lakes where they were known as voyageurs and/or half-breeds. This project focuses on the descendants of the Drummond Islanders who were relocated to Penetanguishene, Ontario, Canada, from what is now Drummond Island in the United States, after Canada relinquished the Island. They were resettled after the war of 1812 and the redrawing of colonial borders, beginning in 1828. In the summer of 2019, several descendants of the former Drummond Islanders had the opportunity to visit Drummond Island as part of a trip with the Metis Nation of Ontario. This was the largest group of descendants to return to the Island since relocation. This exhibit will share photos and digital stories from some of the youth and Elders on what returning to Drummond Island and walking in the footsteps of our ancestors meant. The exhibit will also share voyageur songs, artifacts and create a big root tree for any attendees who are also descendants to add to our contemporary connections. In examining family and personal stories, some historical documents and artifacts from the descendants of Drummond Islanders, it is hoped that we may begin to further understand the interconnections between their/our lives, songs, languages, and relationships.

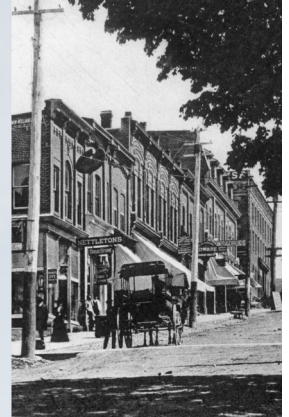
